Enjoy your weekend in the Bay, play hard, play safe, but most importantly "have fun!"







Providing Adults with Developmental Disabilities Lifelong Experiences

ABOUT US - The PADDLE Learning Centre is parent-run initiative that received start-up pilot project funding from the Ontario Ministry of Community and Social Services. Administrative management is facilitated through the Nipissing Association for Disabled Youth (NADY).

HISTORY OF PADDLE - In 2002, a group of North Bay parents of young adults with special needs began to lobby the provincial government for individualized funding to support their children as they transitioned from school to the community. In February 2006, parents joined together to not only lobby for individualized funding but also for start-up funding for a Learning Centre. With the active support of the Honourable Monique Smith, MPP-Nipissing this group of families met with the Honourable Madeleine Meilleur, Minister of Community and Social Services to express their concerns as to the need for community supports for their special needs children. At the request of the Minister, a business plan was submitted for start-up funding of the PADDLE Learning Centre. In March 2007, the PADDLE Learning Centre received full approval with start-up funds provided from the Ministry. PADDLE opened its doors for full-day operation in September 2007 in renovated accommodation within Chippewa Secondary School.

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL 2008 — ADRIAN "BOB" SMITH – TORONTO BINGO



The trophies will be awarded to MVP Players and MVP Pitchers at the conclusion of the AA and A Division Championship games.


Rob played with the Gators here in North Bay in 2000 and 2001.

ORIGIN OF THE SENIOR FASTBALL LEAGUE

(The following are excerpts from History of the League written by Jimmy Russel, one of the founding members. Each year his comments are supplemented with current information)

In the early 1980's every small community in the area had an old-timers's fastball team comprised of players 35 years of age or over, and a pitcher had to be 40 or over. Many of these communities ran their own tournaments to raise money for their teams.

Astorville, a small town southeast of North Bay is commonly given credit for starting the first old-timers's team. Other communities soon joined. They included Powassan, Trout Creek, Sundridge, South River, Callander and Bracebridge.


Initially, the teams only played in as many of the tournaments as they could afford. It is thought that the eventual need for a League was due to the demand of playing tournaments every weekend. Also many of the tournaments began folding for various reasons.

In the summer of 1983 the North Bay Oldtimers Fastball Association was formed. The League was formed as a recreational league with Jimmy's Restaurant, Fraser Tavern and Auto Truck Collision, (formerly Mario's Auto Body) taking part. They were joined by The Cooperators (Liquid Pro Gas). In 1984 the league expanded to six teams with the addition of Kingston Lee Watson and Tilden Rent-a-Car (Cortina's). In 1985, the CFB Silver Foxes and Time Out Lounge joined the circuit bringing the number of teams to eight.

Through the next ten years the League flourished and the spirit of competition was alive and well with many very talented players and executive members contributing to it's success. It was during these years that the games were umpired by the teams themselves to save money. This system worked well in the early years. There were the usual disagreements but generally the benefits out-weighed the few problems. However, this would soon become redundant as the caliber of play steadily improved and the need for rules and regulations created a need for a League Constitution. The other main difference between the Oldtimers League and the GMFA (North Bay's premier fastball League) was the unlimited substitution rule. All players, including pitchers, could rotate freely, defensively. You could choose to bat 9 players or allow all of your players to bat. This rule kept all players actively included in the game. Other rules were written into the constitution such as age requirements and length of games to 7 innings. The prominence of the League was evident when a call was received from the organizers of the Ontario Senior Fastball Championship who asked for a copy of our Constitution to assist them in developing their own. It was due to this championship that the League changed its name from "Oldtimer's" to "Senior". Finally, a minor name change was introduced when "men's" was added to both the League and Tournament constitutions.

In 2005 the League initiated "developmental" player status. This allowed 2 players under 35 who had little previous fastball experience to play. Pitchers with little experience could play at 35. Lack of players continues to be a concern. The League is currently reviewing it's age policy and will make changes as required to ensure the continued success of fastball in the province.

UPDATE: For 2010, the League lost South River and Casey's who had joined in 2009. A general lack of players continues to be a problem for many teams and the "developmental rule" has been relaxed somewhat to help teams with roster problems. The general consensus for local tournaments, including the Worlds is that they may have to address the age concern in the near future. It seems unfair for these younger players to play all year and not be allowed to play in their teams tournaments.



ORIGIN OF THE WORLD SENIOR MEN'S FASTBALL TOURNAMENT

In 1987 the League undertook to organize the World Oldtimer's Fastball Championship and hosted 16 teams in the inaugural event. The name eventually changed from "Oldtimers" to "Senior" (see origin of the League).

The many hours of organizing and planning were handled by the League teams, each which had representation on the League Executive. Entries consisted of mostly local teams with support from outlying areas such as Parry Sound, Bracebridge, Sudbury and Powassan.

Southern, central, eastern and western Ontario teams, and, indeed, even Moosonee and Moose Factory would eventually begin to attend. Many have since been avid supporters who return year after year, for which we are most grateful. It soon became apparent that the caliber of play was divided between recreational teams and competitive teams. The Tournament organizers addressed this challenge by having "A" and "AA" sections where teams could experience the caliber of play they desired. In 2003 the committee experimented with the use of three divisions (A, AA, and AAA). This was not popular and the two division format was reinstated.

Senior Fastball, after suffering throughout the province in previous years, is showing signs of revival as the World Tournament continues to give them a place to play each year.

The Tournament continues to employ the integrated preliminary round. This continues to be very popular. The top 16 play in the AA Championship with the lower 16 playing in the A Championship. Teams playing in the A Championship have indicated that they love this format as it allows them to play some great teams while still having their own event for the playoffs.

In 2006 the Tournament featured ISC carded players. We received a few complaints and concerns that this might affect the "fun" aspect of the event. The Committee has concluded that this concern was not valid. The Cold Springs Cats rose to the occasion by winning to prove that they are still the best even among ISC caliber. In fact, we observed that the ISC players were even having an unusually good time! This proves, once again that no matter how good you are you will always have a good time at the WORLD SENIOR FASTBALL TOURNAMENT.

UPDATE:

The 2010 Tournament is now underway and several new teams have joined us. In most cases their players have been here before and their Managers and/or sponsors have changed. None the less, they are most welcome. As many teams still struggle for players, the Tournament Committee, as well as most local Tournaments, will soon have to address the age restrictions. Our local League has been using developmental players for several years now and it seems unfair that they can't play with their teams in tournaments. Perhaps we could allow underage players that have played all year with a particular team to be exempt from the age rule for that team only. We encourage you to let any member of the committee know your thoughts on this issue. You could also send an e-mail to davecerisano@hotmail.com and include any other comments you have (good or bad) concerning the World Tournament.

For the second year in a row the League has turned down a request to have 3 Divisions in the playoffs. However, another interesting proposal is that used in Niagara Falls where the finals have 4 groups instead of 2. This would eliminate the top team playing the bottom team in the first game.

We also had a request for cash awards. All suggestions are reviewed and we would welcome any additional suggestions.

Again, many people have devoted their time, including all the individuals and teams of our local League. The organizers thank them. Special mention must be given to the CFB - Silver Foxes team who have provided support beyond that of any other group and continue to do so, year after year. Also, special thanks to Jack Green and Bob Alkins who, although they have retired, continues to provide us with the draws and display boards.





2010 TOURNAMENT RULES

OASA rules will apply except for the following "senior" modifications!

SECTION A-GENERAL

AGE: Players must be 35 years of age and pitchers must be 40 years of age prior to first game.

ROSTERS: Final team roster must be presented at registration tent prior to first game.

EQUIPMENT: Metal cleats are not allowed.

PLAYOFF ELIGIBILITY: Players must have played in at least one preliminary game.

HOME TEAM: Decided by the toss of a coin in preliminary rounds. For all playoff games, home team is the team with the highest standing after the preliminary round.

SUBSTITUTION: Defensive re-entry is unlimited.

MINIMUM PLAYERS (ALL GAMES): Teams must field at least 8 players. If using only 8 and the next batter is unable to bat, and no spare is available, game is forfeited and score at that point is recorded. If using 9 or more and the next batter is unable to bat, and no spare is available, his position in the batting order is scratched and next eligible batter shall bat.

BATTERS: All players on the starting lineup may bat. However, if a player on starting lineup is not listed as batting and is used as a pinch hitter, then the player being pinch-hit for is scratched from the batting lineup for the remainder of the game.

PINCH RUNNER: Unlimited substitute runners are allowed, subject to the following; (a) the substitution must take place immediately. A substitute runner is out (as batter) if his turn at bat occurs while he is on base., b) players may not substitute as runners more than once per inning.

PINCH RUNNER FOR CATCHER: with two out, catcher is replaced on base except for home team's last inning.

LENGTH OF GAMES:

All preliminary games: 5 innings (4 ½ if home team is leading). However, no new inning shall start after 60 minutes. Additional reasonable time may be allowed at the umpires discretion. (i.e. injury, rain, field repair, etc.)

All playoff games: 5 full innings with no time restriction.

MERCY RULE: 3 complete innings, (or 2 ½ if home team is leading) when run differential is 10 or more.

DEFAULTED GAMES: Teams arriving more than 5 minutes after scheduled start time incur a 3 - 0 loss.

APPROVED BATTING HELMETS: Double Flap batting helmets must be worn when batting and running bases..

JEWELLERY: Absolutely not allowed. Offending players will be ejected from the game.

SECTION B - TIES

ALL PRELIMINARY GAMES: 1 point to each team.

ALL PLAYOFF GAMES: One extra inning, runner placed on 2nd base; additional extra innings, runners placed on 2nd and 3rd base. (Pinch-runner rules above apply to all playoff games)

SECTION C - RAIN-OUTS

(determined by umpires who may confer with Tournament Committee)

ALL PRELIMINARY GAMES: No innings played - tie declared - 1 point to each team - 3-3 score recorded; Partial game - refer to score of last complete inning. May produce win or tie.

ALL PLAYOFF GAMES: No innings played - winner is team with the best tournament record. If tied, Tournament Committee makes final decision.

ALL PARTIAL GAMES: Revert to score of last complete inning. If tied Tournament, Committee decides.

FINAL GAMES: No innings played - co-winners declared. Tournament Committee makes final decision.

PARTIAL GAME: Revert to score of last complete inning. If tied, co-winners declared.

(Tournament Committee makes all final decisions)


